Goolwa set to glow

Milk production drops during lack of decent rainfall... GREEN DROUGHT

South Australian dairy farmers are facing the toughest conditions for milk production in the country during the worst drought in a century.

Milk production has fallen nearly 8.8 per cent this season and 8.2 per cent compared with August last year, according to the South Australian Dairyfarmers Association. Nationally, production has also dipped, by 3 per cent in the first two months of the season compared with the same time last year.

President Robert Brokenshire – who is also a Mount Compass dairy farmer – credited this decline to the green drought, which he described as “disappointing, stressful and frustrating” for farmers.

Many have had to destock to help with cash flow to buy fodder for existing herds.

“We don’t want to see any dairy farmers exiting the industry,” he said.

“But it’s pretty hard to keep production up when you’re suffering from the worst drought in 100 years.”

Connecting through dance and culture

The Strathalbyn Aboriginal Action and Reference Group Inc (SAARG) held its Cultural Day over the weekend, celebrating and sharing First Nations culture.

Cultural Day organiser Aunty Freda Jaadawa-Mills said the day "went really fantastic".

"Everybody was saying thank you for a good show — all the kids and everybody that participated, it went down really fantastic," she said.

Aunty Freda estimates that about 200 people came on the day held at The Riding Patch at Strathalbyn.

"The Riding Patch was really helpful in planning things and on the day," she said.

Aunty Freda said a highlight of the day was all the dancing.

"It was really good, very spiritual (and) very loving to be connected to land like that," Aunty Freda said.

"Uncle Moogy Sumner welcomed us to Country, and his group danced.

"It was very moving.

"I was part of the Imbala Dance Group — when we're dancing, it's expressing our culture and showing to community that (we) express culture through song and dance."

The dances from the day all told different stories and showcased Aboriginal peoples

and non-Indigenous people dancing together.

Aunty Freda said the first Imbala Aboriginal Contemporary Dance Group's dance was the ochre dance, and the second was a learning and teaching dance.

Another highlight from the day was the weaving workshops.

"The weaving is about connecting people ... it's using their hands and eyes to weave — it's therapeutic," Aunty Freda said.

"We also had a menu of bush foods, which were tasty, and stalls with all sorts of things.

"Singing in language, and live music on the didj were great too."

The throughline of the day was connectivity, not just for First Nations peoples but also involving non-Indigenous people.

"It's about non-Indigenous (people) getting involved in learning," Aunty Freda said.

"So, we're gaining their respect and we respect them, it's just a two-way street.

"We invite them (non-Indigenous people) in to share our history (with) them, so then they've got a better understanding and knowledge about Aboriginal history."

A goal of the Cultural Day was to raise money for a national Corroboree to be held in Strathalbyn next year.

Aunty Freda said the "fundraising went really well."

Similar Corroborees used to take place in Strathalbyn until 139 years ago, some having people from all over the country come down

to meet where the rotunda is now.

Aunty Freda is confident they will be able to hold the Corroboree come 2026.

"We will reach our goal," Aunty Freda said. "We don't hope to, we will."

Aunty Freda and the organising committee want to thank Starlight Foundation, Alexandrina Council, the SA Government Drought Response, Kathy Angel and The Riding Patch volunteers, SAARG volunteers, The Neighbourhood Centre volunteers, and others. Thanks to all who were involved with the Cultural Day; without their support, they would not have been able to put the day on.

Goolwa rezoning proposes 400 new homes

Four hundred new homes could be built on the outskirts of Goolwa, after a major rezoning proposal was lodged to reclassify 28 hectares of land.

Developer Craven Securities hopes to rezone the land located on Alexandrina Road and Glendale Grove from Deferred Urban to Master Planned Township Zone, allowing for a mixture of residential, education and community uses.

The application – recently opened for public consultation – states the Code Amendment would allow for about 400 new homes with 15 per cent to be affordable housing, shops and community facilities around the town's high school.

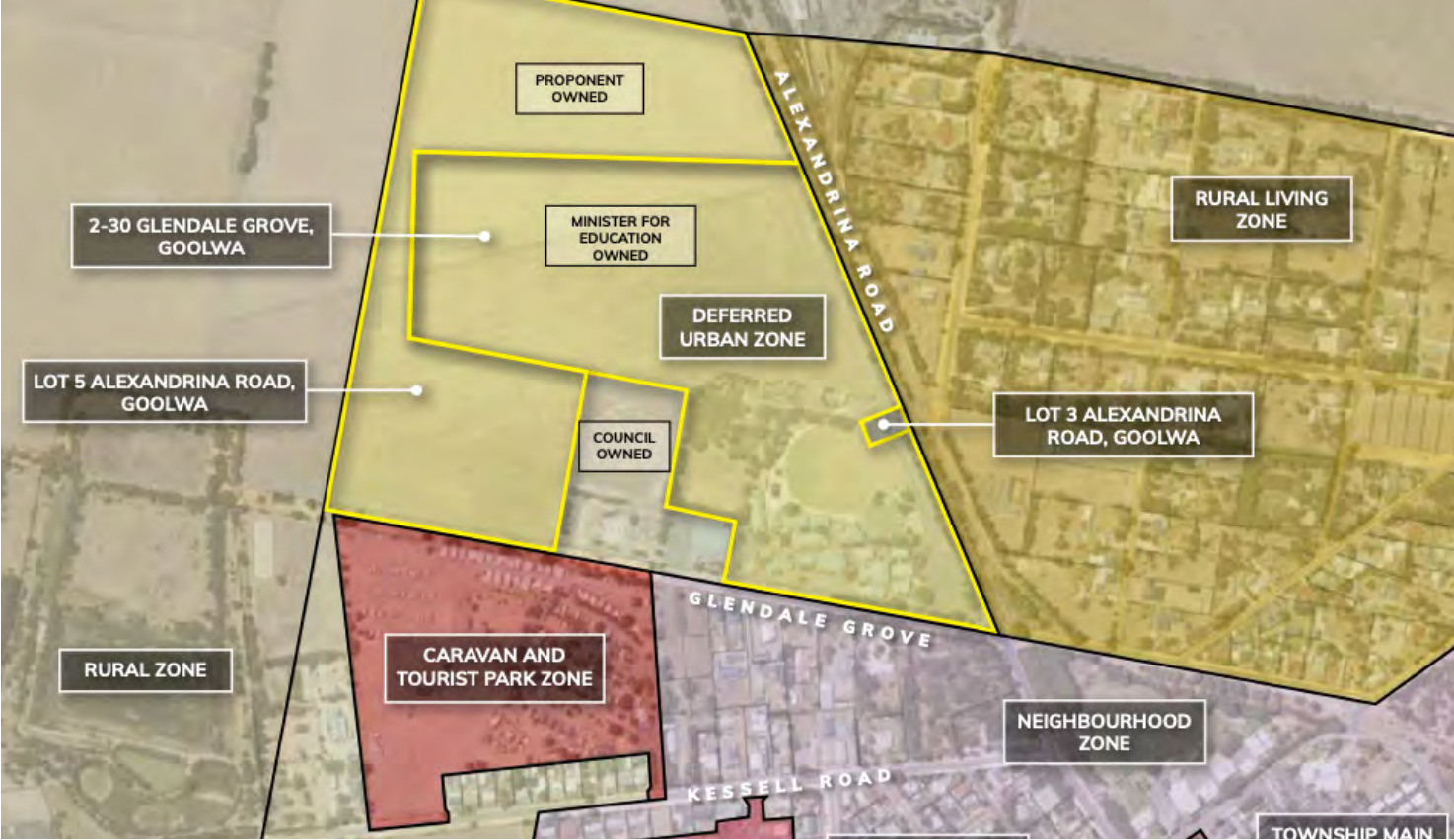
The aim is for residents to “live locally” – so they can access education and shopping within walking and cycling distance.

Further, an Emerging Activity Centre Subzone has also been proposed, to enable local retail, childcare, and other community services.

“The development will be integrated with Goolwa Secondary College, enabling a logical expansion of the township for residential and community uses,” the documents stated.

“The proposal aims to bring the community closer to education services while also providing space for the future expansion of the existing school, should the need arise.”

Public consultation opened on Monday and closes on December 7.

The document states that Goolwa has more than double the future urban growth potential than any other township in the region.

The draft Greater Regional Adelaide Plan – a long-term planning document for growth across greater Adelaide to 2051 and beyond –

identifies Goolwa as one of the towns in the Fleurieu Peninsula to take on a substantial portion of future growth.

This also comes after other proposed development in the town, including a Code Amendment under assessment for Lakeside Goolwa to be rezoned from rural living to

residential park, to meet the growing demand for affordable retirement living.

An estate of 2500 new homes have also been proposed for Goolwa North.

The town has had an average annual growth rate of 2.7 per cent in a five-year period from 2016 to 2021, from 7771 to 8756 residents.

Tool library helps gardens and locals thrive

A simple idea of a tool library is supporting Strathalbyn locals to get their gardens in shape ahead of summer while boosting wellbeing and connections.

The Tool Library, introduced to the area by housing and community services provider Junction, enables people to borrow key equipment to maintain their properties.

Run out of the repair shed in the Strath Neighbourhood Centre, items currently available for hire include an electric lawn mower and whipper snippers.

Junction Head of Impact, Alisa Willis, said the concept had proven helpful to people who would otherwise struggle to maintain their yards.

“In many cases, properties only have small squares of grass,” Ms Willis said.

“Forking out for a lawn mower or paying someone to come in regularly isn’t ideal for everyone.

“This way, people can take pride in their gardens without the price tag.”

Strath Neighbourhood Centre Manager, Mal Sutcliffe, agreed, finding many people find buying equipment is financially out of reach.

“It’s the difference between that or putting food on the table,” Mr Sutcliffe said.

“It’s also very empowering for people.

“It enables them to be independent.”

He said borrowing was more than a transaction for many people, as it also gives them an opportunity to connect with the centre’s volunteers.

“We’ve helped one person who was struggling and really wanted to create a garden,” Mr Sutcliffe said.

“With the equipment and support from our Garden Grubs (volunteers) we were able to help out.

“The turnaround for that person, in terms of their garden and their wellbeing, has been phenomenal – I hear their garden is now flourishing, it’s quite magnificent.”

The Strathalbyn Tool Library is one of three supported by Junction across the state with others based in Marion and Kingscote.

“All the research shows gardening is good for our wellbeing so we want to support people to do that,” Ms Willis said.

“Having the initiative based in the Neighbourhood Centre is really important because it paves the way for people to connect with their community and there are so many added benefits that stem from that.”

The Tool Library is open Monday to Friday, 9am to 3.30pm.

Borrowing is free for Junction tenants while members of the public can also access items for a small fee.

Major fire at Goolwa

A battery has been confirmed as the cause of a major shed fire at Goolwa on Saturday which caused more than \$500,000 worth of damages.

About 50 Country Fire Service (CFS) firefighters, with support from MFS crews, worked from the afternoon into the early hours of the following morning to contain the fire at Goolwa Waste and Recycling Depot shed, which was closed since.

The fire sparked a reminder to local residents and businesses that batteries are prohibited from being thrown into rubbish, but should be disposed in allocated depots.

“We thank all people who do the right thing with batteries, and ask everyone to please help keep our staff safe,” they posted on social media.

The shed was full of cardboard, plastic and other materials that caused a lot of smoke to drift over the western end of Goolwa.

Heavy machinery was used to spread out waste piles so crews in breathing apparatus could extinguish the fire.

“The type of fuel, and its arrangement meant that water from the hoses could not penetrate to the seat of the fire,” Strathalbyn CFS explained on social media.

“The best option was to use a front end loader to scoop up a bucket load of burning material and deposit it outside so that crews could extinguish it, one bucket at a time.”

Thanks to volunteers’ response, firefighters were able to prevent the fire from spreading beyond the shed, which was partially destroyed.

Firefighters remained on scene into the early hours of the morning to monitor for any smouldering areas.

SA Police and SA Ambulance were also on scene supporting crews, while fire investigators also attended.

Crash at Strathalbyn

SA Police were called to reports of a two-vehicle crash involving a Ford sedan and a Mazda at the intersection of East and South Terrace, Strathalbyn on the evening of October 12.

The driver of the Mazda, a 40-year-old man from Parndana, was issued an expiation notice for failing to give way.

No injuries were reported.

Crash at Finnis

SA Police was called to reports of a single vehicle collision involving a Mitsubishi 4WD on Dry Plains Road, Finnis, on the morning of October 9.

The driver, a 17-year-old boy from Strathalbyn, was conveyed to hospital with minor injuries and for a blood alcohol test.

Investigations into the collision are ongoing.

Grass fire at Gemmells

A spark grassfire ignited at Gemmells on Sunday.

Five Country Fire Service (CFS) trucks and about 20 firefighters responded to the fire adjacent to the train tracks.

Smoking batteries

Two Country Fire Service (CFS) trucks responded to reports of smoking batteries in a caravan at Goolwa North on the evening of October 7.

Two people were transported by SA Ambulance Service.

Our green drought

While many of our paddocks across the region look lovely and green, for our dairy farmers, for example, the one-in-100-year drought appears far from over.

South Australian Dairyfarmers Association President Robert Brokenshire says milk production has dropped almost 8.8 per cent this season, which he credits to an ongoing 'green drought'.

That's when paddocks appear green, but without a proper good soaking, the pasture lacks moisture, fibre, nutrition and thickness.

For Mr Brokenshire, who is a dairy farmer at Mount Compass, he believes the drought is therefore yet to properly break.

The Bureau of Meteorology is predicting some rain in weeks ahead, but it is looking like it may not reach the "good soaking" needed for dairy farmers at least.

Dairy cattle are reliant on proper healthy pastures to produce first-class milk, and the lack of them Mr Brokenshire says, is the reason behind that drop in the production of milk.

Mr Brokenshire, though, remains positive, thinking a break in the drought and a subsequent 'normal' season, followed by some above average season will help meet an expected demand in milk – including locally in Murray Bridge with the relocation of ice cream producer Golden North.

Golden North is hopeful of sourcing milk locally – and for that we need good conditions.

Farmers are by necessity resourceful people, but Mother Nature has to play her part.



Call SafeWork SA for advice on improving farm safety

Farmers are being encouraged to contact SafeWork SA's free Advisory Service and obtain specialist information and advice about improving safety in agriculture.

Safework SA has issued the call as part of its farm safety campaign, which began at the beginning of the month.

It aims to reduce the number of workplace deaths and injuries in the state's agricultural industry.

Six workplace deaths in the sector and at least 13 serious injuries were notified to SafeWork SA in 2024-25.

The fatalities included three quadbike crashes, one worker trapped in farm machinery, and two trapped in grain silos.

The alarming number of incidents occurred on worksites across regional South Australia.

SafeWork SA began a farm safety campaign this month to assist in reducing the number of workplace deaths and injuries by ensuring compliance with Work Health and Safety laws.

The 12-month campaign involves SafeWork SA Inspectors visiting a number of farms, including those identified as having a high number of workplace injury claims.

The farms will be audited for their compliance with WHS laws with a focus on:

- Use and maintenance of farming plant and equipment, including tractors and all-terrain vehicles (ATVs)
- Guarding of plant and equipment such as augers and conveyers
- Falls from heights
- Electrical safety
- Personal protective equipment
- Chemical handling and storage
- Induction and training for all workers
- Working in confined spaces (silos)
- Induction and training for new workers

As part of the Safety in Agriculture campaign, farmers are encouraged to contact SafeWork SA's Advisory Service to help make their properties safer for themselves, their workers and their families.

The Advisory Service offers free safety advice and resources while a specialist advisor with industry experience can visit to provide practical assistance with reducing

WHS hazards. Advertisements have also been launched throughout regional media and on digital platforms to remind farmers about their WHS obligations and how SafeWork SA can assist.

Agriculture is of vital importance to South Australia's economy, employing more than 30,000 South Australians, or about 3 per cent of the state's workforce.

Primary production (agriculture, forestry and fisheries) contributed more than \$7.8 billion to the state's economy in the last financial year.

It is also one of six national priority industries for safety regulators due to the large number of serious incidents in the industry.

Goolwa set to shine with light parade

A parade of boats twinkling with Christmas lights will light up the river in Goolwa, introducing a new tradition to the town's festive season.

Organised by Goolwa Community Association, the inaugural Goolwa Christmas Flotilla celebrates the uniqueness of the town's boating culture and love for the river.

The event, inspired by a Christmas lights boat parade at Bribie Island, Queensland, is one of very few in Australia.

Free to enter, welcoming any powered or

non-powered boats, the flotilla will conclude the Goolwa Christmas Concert at Jaralde Park on December 20 at about 8.30pm, leaving from Bombora, down to Riverview Deli and Cafe, before returning.

Community members on the shore are encouraged to hold lanterns or lights to add to the glow, with Goolwa Tidy Towns volunteers hosting a lantern making workshop in the lead-up.

The Goolwa Community Association was formed in recent years to help organise the town's Christmas celebrations and other events throughout the year.

Last year's pageant and concert sadly had to be cancelled due to extreme heat, but 2025's program is set to be even bigger and better, being spread across two days, with the pageant on December 7, and the concert

and flotilla on December 20.

The pageant is highly-anticipated, being the first since before COVID.

The procession will start at the town's oval, come out of Goyder Street and down the main strip, before finishing at Gardiner Street.

Families may even get a chance to get a photo with Santa behind the Goolwa Hotel before he flies back to the North Pole in preparation for Christmas.

Volunteers are encouraging anyone to enter, including floats or walkers in costume, showcasing lots of fun and colour.

Excitingly, Bluey and her sister Bingo are expected to also join the pageant, escorted by Jacqui's Private Car Hire, and a couple of eye-catching props will also be used from the city's pageant.

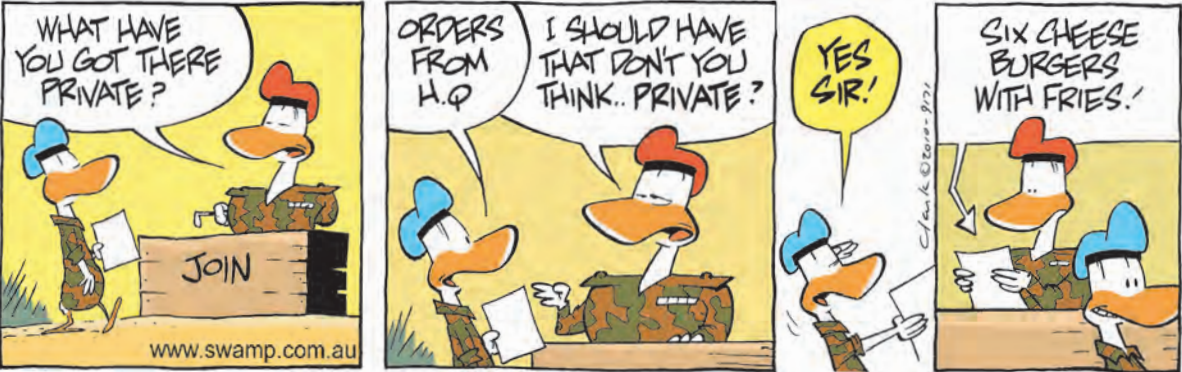

Creating an effective Estate Plan

An Estate Plan, in essence, consists of three documents: your Will, Enduring Power of Attorney and Advance Care Directive, which should be prepared with care.

Anyone with property is encouraged to make a Will with guidance from a solicitor.

The process is less expensive than many think, and the consequences of not doing so can be significant.

Many people assume that preparing a Will is a simple process and either write one out themselves or obtain a Will kit to do so.

However, sometimes the results can be very unfortunate for family members. For example, the correct wording of a Will is very important to give full effect to your wishes.

Further, it is most important to regularly review your Will to take account of major events, such as the birth of children, or significant changes to the value of your assets.

In extreme cases, such as when the terms of the Will are unclear or if parties are unable to agree on the proper construction of those terms, it may be necessary to apply to the Court to determine the issue, at large cost to the estate of the deceased.

Situations frequently arise where the formal legal requirements of a Will have not been adhered to, such as when a Will is signed in front of only one witness.

Whilst this is not fatal, extra work and greater expense will be involved; particularly if it is necessary to make an application for

probate for such a Will.

As to Powers of Attorney, many people find at various times in their lives (but particularly as they age) that they need assistance to carry out the tasks of daily living.

An Enduring Power of Attorney can be made operative either immediately upon being signed by the person making it, known as 'the donor' or alternatively if the donor suffers mental incapacity.

An attorney is granted power to look after the financial and business side of the donor's life, such as their banking, signing contracts and purchasing goods and services on behalf of the donor.

Finally, the Advance Care Directives Act permits a person to sign a document appointing others to make their health care, residential accommodation and personal affairs arrangements if the person becomes mentally incapacitated.

Provided that the person does not suffer a mental incapacity, both documents are capable of, and should be reviewed regularly.

Your Will, Enduring Power of Attorney and Advance Care Directive are important documents.

Consulting a solicitor with knowledge and experience is essential to ensure that wishes are properly set out and formal requirements have been met.

THERE'S NO TIME FOR DOWN TIME THIS SEASON

Hectic bee season ahead

By Deirdre Graham

Beekeepers are expecting this year's bee season to be "a little more hectic" compared to last year, when dry conditions were recorded across the region.

Nathan Brown is a beekeeper based in Mount Barker and said last year had left bees under nourished.

"This season we have had a lot of good rain and everything else, so they are going to be like 'hey, it is getting a bit cramped in here, there is enough food, we can all survive and co-exist, so let's split,'" Mr Brown said.

"You will see more swarms, and I predict it is going to carry on a bit further into next year, just because they haven't been able to do (their job) properly in over a year.

"They are a bit cramped at the moment, their little house is a bit full, and they are struggling to fit into their home."

He said September/October was the optimum time for bees to begin swarming.

"There is not enough food out there for the bees (in winter) because it gets all washed out, therefore this time of the year is nice and warm (and) they like to venture out into the world," Mr Brown said.

Bees play an integral role in nature by cross pollinating many plants.

"Pollination works when you have a male flower and a female flower," Mr Brown said.

"They have to cross their genetics over so they can produce seeds and everything else.

"Without the bees, without having everything in its natural order... we can't survive with employing people with a paint brush to try and work it out - what needs to

be crossed with what.

"Everything has its purpose with flowers, that is why you see my place full of weeds and everything else.

"If plants don't get what they need, which is the bees helping them out, via

cross-pollination, you will start to see plants decreasing in growth, and stop being healthy."

This includes mass grown fruits and vegetables such as watermelons and pumpkins.

While Mr Brown provides his bees to farmers who need cross pollination, he also produces honey.

"Honey is made between seven bees, for a single drop of honey throughout their life span," Mr Brown said.

"A bee has to get a belly full of nectar, they then take that back to the hive, and transfer that one drop of nectar to decrease the sugar in the nectar from one bee to another bee seven times, and then they store that away and it will ferment.

"It ferments in the hive for a couple of weeks before it turns to honey, and then we come along and harvest the honey, leave some for the bees to still have food – and that is where you get your honey from.

"The bees work very hard over their 90 days through every season, other than winter where they live 45 days, to make a single drop of honey for their lifespan."

He said honey continues to be a healthier option for humans than white sugars.

"It cuts out all the bad bacteria and helps us stay level in our health balance," Mr Brown said.

"The sugar canes aren't a healthy sugar, whereas honey is made organically from bees, from the nectar which is intended to be eaten, and a lot better for you if you are health conscious."

Mr Brown encouraged people who may have an unwelcome swarm of bees in their property to contact a beeper.

"Bees need a home like us, we all don't want to be homeless, we need a nice little cosy spot, it is not their fault that they are trying to co-exist with us," he added.

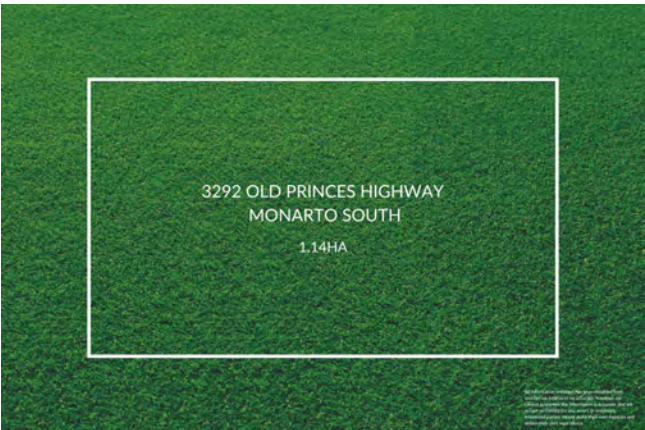

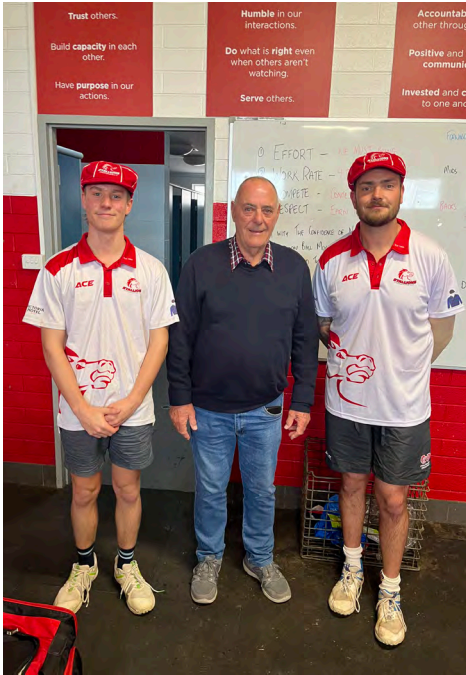
Despite the third wicket not falling until 133 was on the board the Stallions were keeping things tight and taking the game deep.

Elliott’s countdown to November

Former Strathalbyn footballer Elliott Duffield has several nervous weeks ahead of him, as he waits to see if he gets an offer at November’s AFL Draft.

Duffield, who currently plays for South Adelaide, took part in the 2025 Telstra AFL State Draft Combine on Saturday, and told *The Southern Argus* he was happy with his performance.

The AFL contenders had to complete a 2km time trial, agility test, 20m sprint, standing vertical jump, running vertical jump, and a new test called Counter Movement Jump (CMJ) which measures the force athletes produce when jumping.

“I think the combine went really well for me,” Duffield said.

“I was around a good group of boys that made it a bit less stressful, especially with lots of scouts in the stands – it definitely adds a bit of pressure – but I think the work I did beforehand set me up really well.

“We didn’t find out our vertical jump

results, but I was happy with my agility test, and happy with the jumps even though we don’t know what they are yet.

“With the 2km time trial I was satisfied with what I got, a 6:58, but I was probably hoping for a bit quicker time, and the 20m sprint I was also satisfied with that as well.

“We won’t find out all our results, for I am not sure how long, but definitely my running vertical jump will be my strongest point.”

Leading up to the Draft Combine Duffield worked on a number of different aspects of his fitness.

“Definitely more the athletic events, so the jumping events, lots of power movement and plyometrics stuff to strengthen my lower body, and then a lot of technique stuff as well,” he said.

“I spent heaps of hours with my personal trainer on the technique side of things.”

Duffield said talks with prospective clubs was going well, saying so far he has had discussions with Collingwood, St Kilda and the Sydney Swans.

He has his fingers crossed.

“It is just a waiting game, which is I guess a little bit stressful,” Duffield said.

“I just have to wait until the Draft on November 19 to 21 – a three-day period, just waiting until then, (but) just (try to) relax for a bit, and switch off for a few weeks.”

He said he would take an offer from any AFL club, saying being selected would make a childhood dream come true.

“Yes, 100 per cent, just hoping to get onto a list is definitely the main goal,” Duffield said.

“It would mean the world, I have dreamed about it ever since I was a little kid, growing up with the footy club, always being with the footy club – especially following Dad’s footsteps, so it would mean the world to me.

“I would be absolutely stoked and overwhelmed if I was lucky enough to be picked up.

“There are a few decisions to make between now and the Draft, but I guess

a lot of it relies on the Draft, so once again, it’s about playing the waiting game.”
